The first auction for large-scale projects in Croatia took place in to procure 638 MW of new capacity. However, it only attracted tepid interest, with premiums awarded to just 107 MW of projects. How much does electricity cost in Croatia? Croatia, September : The price of electricity for households is EUR 0.150 per kWh or USD 0.160 per kWh.
