



Follow-up on Sierra Leone's green base station

Does Sierra Leone have a low energy access rate? Sierra Leone currently has one of the lowest energy access rates globally, with only 36% of its population connected to the grid and a mere 6% in rural areas. The SOGREA Initiative supports the government's aim to increase the share of renewable energy in the country's energy mix to 35% by 2030. "By 2030, Sierra Leone will be fully illuminated. What is the SOGREA initiative & how does it help Sierra Leone? The SOGREA initiative directly supports Sierra Leone's Energy Transition and Green Growth Plan (ETGGP), launched in November under the Presidential Initiative on Climate Change, Renewable Energy, and Food Security (PICREF).
