



Gabon Solar System Battery Plant

Developed by Solen SA Gabon, a subsidiary of Solen Renewable Dubai, the plant aims to expand to 30 MW under a power purchase agreement with the national utility, Sociéte d'Energie et d'Eau du Gabon (SEEG). Once completed, it is expected to power 300,000 homes and create 150 jobs. One of the major projects supporting this goal is the Grand Poubara Dam, a hydroelectric project costing over \$190 million.
