



How to charge the base station battery

To charge a base station lithium battery, you can follow these general guidelines:

- Use the Manufacturer's Charger:** Always use the charger recommended by the manufacturer to ensure safe and effective charging.
- Charging Methods:** You can charge lithium batteries using various methods.

Base's batteries operate in charge-discharge cycles optimized for grid-balancing. They send energy back to the grid when it's needed most and charge when there's an abundance. The compensation Base receives for efficiently stabilizing the grid is what keeps your energy rates low and gives you

Firmware 2.10 (January) added a new feature that allows your system to detect when the Base Station's batteries are not able to charge correctly. If it detects an issue, you'll get the warning "Battery Failure - Base Station Batteries are not charging". To resolve the issue, you'll want to

- Green:** Battery is fully charged.
- Red:** Battery is charging.
- No light:** Charger is not connected to a Power Outlet or is not working properly - faulty charger and/or cable.

REMOVE batteries from Base Station after use. Batteries **MUST NOT** be stored inside the Base Station.

Check Battery status Kit (Battery) is used to create stationary battery cells, which can provide big and stable energy storage or energy buffer for your power needs. Its energy storage is 3.6MJ or 1kWh. Any battery slowly loses stored energy. Batteries in a vacuum drain at 50W. Batteries in atmosphere at drain at 10W
