Will Uzbekistan fund a 250-megawatt solar photovoltaic plant?TASHKENT, May 21, -- The World Bank Group, Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company PJSC (Masdar), and the Government of Uzbekistan have signed a financial package to fund a 250-megawatt (MW) solar photovoltaic plant with a 63-MW battery energy storage system (BESS). How will Uzbekistan improve its energy security?"This project will enhance Uzbekistan's energy security through the use of innovative solutions and technologies," noted Marco Mantovanelli, World Bank Country Manager for Uzbekistan. Who will sell electricity to in Uzbekistan?The project company is committed to selling electricity to the state-owned National Electric Grid of Uzbekistan JSC under a 25-year Power Purchase Agreement for the project, including a 10-year operating term for the BESS component, signed by these two entities. How does the World Bank help Uzbekistan?These efforts support the country's clean energy transition and decarbonization, as well as its economic growth. In this context, the World Bank Group is helping Uzbekistan develop 2,000 MW of solar and 500 MW of wind energy by attracting private sector investments. Where is PPPA project located in Uzbekistan?The proposed project site is in the Karatau mountain region in Beruniy and Qorao'zak Districts in Karakalpakstan, Northwestern Uzbekistan. A 25-year PPPA has been awarded to ACWA through a competitive tender and signed on March 28, , with the National Electric Grid of Uzbekistan (NEGU) as the Public Partner (off taker). Who owns the land in Uzbekistan?Social and Gender Aspects: The entire land in Uzbekistan as per the country law belongs to the government. The Wind Farm (WF) and the OHTL will require land acquisition of around 103 Ha. The Project involves the construction, ownership and operation of solar power plants that can generate 1,000 MW, equivalent to the annual electricity consumption of approximately 600,000 households, and large-scale battery energy storage systems (BESS), with a total storage capacity of 1,336 MWh, located in the Samarkand and Bukhara regions of Uzbekistan.
